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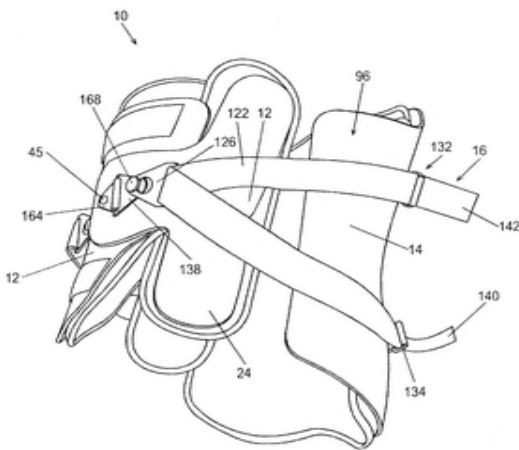

General Information

A Body Jacket is a custom molded plastic brace designed to protect, stabilize and limit motion in your spine and torso



HowTo Guidelines

The Best Fit

It is extremely important to wear your Body Jacket in the correct place. There are indentations on the inside area of the brace. This area should be at your waist in line with your belly button just above your hip bones and just below the ribs. You may use this guide to assist in positioning the body jacket correctly. The Body Jacket is custom made to each individual's body and is meant to be worn as snug as possible. This will provide the most support to your spine and torso. Please be aware that Spinal Orthotics tend to "ride up" on the body. To ensure proper positioning throughout the day you will need to readjust your Body Jacket. Do not become discouraged, should you feel an adjustment is needed. Minor adjustments may be required to ensure a good fit. Contact our offices to schedule an appointment with your Orthotist.

Caring Guidelines

Skin Care

Each time you remove the Body Jacket, please inspect the skin thoroughly for any red or irritated areas. Areas of redness that do not fade after 20 minutes should be watched very carefully especially if the patient has diabetes and/or poor sensation. Irritation of the skin may occur from moisture or bacteria on the skin or improper positioning of the body jacket. We recommend you always wear a clean, dry, well-fitting 100% cotton T-shirt under the Body Jacket. This will assist in absorbing perspiration as well as aid in protecting the skin. To help reduce moisture and bacteria under the jacket we suggest wiping the skin with alcohol wipes. A bit of baby powder may also be applied, but avoid using too much as this could cause issues. Your physician will provide you with instructions and precautions with bathing. At any time should the Body Jacket get wet, it needs to be completely dried before it is put on to avoid skin irritation.

Body Jacket Care

The Body Jacket should be cleaned at least once a week using water and a mild antibacterial soap. Remember to rinse well to remove any soap residue. To help fight bacteria you may use rubbing alcohol. This will also help with removing soap residue.
